

OFFICIAL NOTICE OF PRIMARY ELECTION
TUESDAY, JUNE 7, 2022
ALL POLLS OPEN FROM 7:00 A.M TO 8:00 P.M.

Notice is hereby given to the qualified electors of Jasper County, State of Iowa, that the Primary Election will be held on Tuesday, June 7, 2022. As a reminder, you must declare a political party to cast either a Democratic or Republican ballot for the Primary Election.

All polls will be open from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M. Voters MUST vote in their precinct of residence. In accordance with IAC 721-21.50(10) and Chapter 49.3 of the Iowa Code, any voter who is physically unable to enter their polling place has the right to vote in the voter's vehicle. Any voter who requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, disability, or inability to read or write may be given assistance by a person of the voter's choice, other than the voter's employer or agent of that employer or officer or agent of the voter's union.

Please read this notice carefully to determine your correct voting location. * The decennial census and its corresponding redistricting process re-drew legislative boundaries resulting in several polling location changes within Jasper County. Boundaries are established for ten years. Precincts and polling places have changed for many residents. The new precincts are now in effect and the first scheduled election using the new precincts is the Primary Election. The precincts and voting locations listed in this notice are the new permanent locations.* If you are unsure of your precinct of residence or voting location for this election, please contact the Jasper County Auditor's office at 641-792-7016 or by email at auditor@jaspercounty.iowa.gov. ***CCI: Clear Creek/Independence; Baxter City Hall, 203 S. Main, Baxter, IA 50028**-For voters living in the city of Baxter and Clear Creek and Independence townships. Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

CF 1, CF 2, CF 3 Colfax 1, Colfax 2 and Colfax 3; Jasper County Fairgrounds, 359 Walnut St., Colfax, IA 50054-For all voters living within the Colfax City limits. Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

DM: Des Moines; Prairie City Community Building, 503 S. State St., Prairie City, IA 50228-For voters living in Prairie City and Des Moines Township. Your new State Congressional district is District 37.

FV: Fairview; Monroe City Hall, 206 W. Sherman, Monroe, IA 50170-For voters living in the City of Monroe and Fairview township. Your new State Congressional district is District 37.

***HR: Hickory Grove, Kellogg, Mariposa, and Rock Creek; Kellogg City Hall, 417 Front St., Kellogg, IA 50135**-For voters living in the cities of Kellogg and Oakland Acres and Hickory Grove, Kellogg, Mariposa, and Rock Creek townships. Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

***LR: Lynngrove/Richland; Sully Community Center, 318 6th Ave., Sully, IA 50251**
For voters living in the Cities of Lynnville and Sully and Lynngrove and Richland townships. Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

***MNS: Malaka/Newton/Sherman; Jasper County Church of Christ, 1813 1st St. N., Newton, IA 50208**
For voters living in the city of Lambs Grove and Malaka, Newton, and Sherman townships. Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

***MPPW: Mound Prairie/Poweshiek/Washington; Jasper County Fairgrounds, 359 Walnut St., Colfax, IA 50054**-For voters living in the cities of Mingo, Mitchellville and Valeria and the townships of Mound Prairie, Poweshiek, and Washington. Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

***NT 4-1: Newton City Ward 4 Precinct 1; Jasper County Admin. Building, 300 W. 4th St. N., Newton, IA 50208** Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

NT 4-2: Newton City Ward 4 Precinct 2; American Legion, 1101 W. 4th St. S., Newton, IA 50208
Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

PA: Palo Alto; Reasnor City Hall, 312 North St., Reasnor, IA 50232 For voters living in Reasnor and Palo Alto Township. Your new State Congressional district is District 38.

The Voter Pre-Registration Deadline for this Election is May 23, 2022 in the Auditor's Office or by mail if postmarked on or before May 23, 2022. The deadline for registered voters to request an Absentee Ballot by mail is May 23, 2022. If an eligible elector is unable to register to vote on or before the registration deadline, Iowa Law permits Election Day Registration at their polling location with current proof of Identity AND Residence within the precinct.

All voters are required to provide an approved form of identification at the polling place before receiving and casting a ballot. Voters who are not pre-registered – such as voters registering to vote on election day – and voters who have changed precincts will also be required to provide proof of residence. A voter who cannot provide proof of identification may have their identity attested to by another voter registered in the precinct who has an approved form of identification. Any voter unable to prove identity and residence at the polling place has the option to cast a provisional ballot AND provide proof of identity and residence to the County Auditor before Noon on June 13, 2022.

A person who is eligible to register to vote, may register on election day and vote by appearing in person at the polling place for the precinct in which the individual resides. The voter must complete a voter registration application, sign a written oath, and provide acceptable proof of identity and acceptable proof of residence. Acceptable documents which can be used as proof of identity and proof of residence are very specific and substitutes will not be accepted. ELECTION FRAUD. A voter commits the crime of Election Misconduct in the First Degree if the person submits false information when registering to vote. Election misconduct in the first degree is a class “D” felony, and punishable by a fine of up to \$10,245 and/or imprisonment of up to five (5) years. Convicted felons who register and vote without receiving a restoration of voting rights from the Governor are committing a class “D” felony.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN, in accordance with Chapter 52.35 of the Iowa Code that the duly authorized agents of the Jasper County Auditor and Commissioner of Elections shall publicly examine and test all voting machines to be used for the June 7, 2022 Primary Election. Public testing will begin on Tuesday, May 31, at 1:00 p.m. at the Election Equipment Building located at 113 W. 2nd St. S., Newton.

Election results will be posted on the Jasper County Elections website on Election Night after the polls close.
