Other News:

*We continue to serve clients over the phone, doing care coordination, presumptive eligibility, & developmental screens. The USDA waiver which allows WIC to serve clients remotely is set to expire 2/20/21. At this point in time, we don't know if the waiver will be allowed to expire, or if it will be extended. The IDPH WIC Office indicated they will notify us as soon as the USDA has informed them of the plan. While we miss seeing our clients, their health & safety is paramount.

*Per IDPH, there will be no RFA for FY22, which means we won't be writing a grant for the next fiscal year. I don't know if that's ever happened before, but it's definitely interesting! That means that our next MCAH grant will be an RFP for FY23 (October 1, 2022-September 30, 2023). It will be a competitive grant year, & Jasper County will no longer be in our service area beginning FY23.

Marion County Public Health's I-Smile™ program proudly provides preventive dental service to Appanoose, Clarke, Decatur, Jasper, Lucas, Marion, Monroe, Poweshiek, Ringgold and Wayne Counties!

⇒ **The return of the I-Smile™ Program!**

The I-Smile™ program has returned offering direct service clinics to preschools and elementary schools, WIC clinics are still virtual. I-Smile™ has been making calls and providing care coordination as needed to the WIC clients. WIC has a USDA waiver through Feb 2021

I-Smile clinics are following CDC guidelines & IDPH guidance infection control measures to keep kiddos, school staff and MCPH I-Smile™ staff safe and healthy.

The I-Smile™ program has been affected by the COVID-19 pandemic, resulting in fewer consents received and restricted from some schools for the 2020-21 school year.

⇒ **I-Smile™ Early Childhood Fluoride Program**



I-Smile™ Fluoride program serves all preschool and head start programs in ten counties twice per school year, fall & spring. We provide a dental screening, fluoride varnish application and age appropriate dental education.

Care coordination is provided to families when a child has suspected decay, a high-risk screening. Each child must have parental consent to participate.

➔ I-Smile™ @ School Sealant Program



The I-Smile™ @ School Sealant Program serves eligible elementary schools (higher than 40% free & reduced lunch rate) in MCPH ten-county service area once per school year. The dental teams set up a mini-dental clinic and provide FREE preventive dental services. Dental screening, fluoride varnish applications, sealants applied if needed and individualized oral hygiene instruction. Each child must have parental consent to participate.

*The online link was piloted last year, 2019-20 school year. Our hope is online registration will eliminate the need for schools to pass out & collect forms and reduce printing cost for the program. We will supply each school with a minimal number of copies for the families without access to internet. The online registration is for the school-based sealant program only.

I-Smile™ will continue to partner with dental & medical providers and community members to build a strong referral network that provides families the services they need. I-Smile™ will continue to keep Iowa families healthy by providing care coordination to over-come barriers that may be preventing access to necessary medical and dental treatment.

Check out the Dental Education Loan Repayment / FIND Project through Delta Dental!

Our home – the state of Iowa – has over 3 million people. And not all of them have the same access to good oral health care.

The Fulfilling Iowa's Need for Dentists (FIND) Project is committed to connecting dentists and underserved communities with the resources needed to combat Iowa's dental shortage, so dental care is close to home for every Iowan. The FIND program is an extension of the Delta Dental of Iowa Loan Repayment Program and offers a \$50,000 award annually for the repayment of dental education debt to be used over a three-year grant period.

It collaborates with communities on the recruitment and establishment of a private practicing dental office located in rural, underserved areas in Iowa for up to \$100,000 loan repayment award.

In return, the selected dentist agrees to allocate 35% of patient services to underserved!

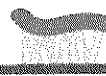
